Subject: Extension of Special concessions / incentives to the Central Government employees working in Kashmir Valley in attached / subordinate offices or PSUs falling under control of the Central Government for a further period of three years with effect from 1st day of August, 2024 - regarding.

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Department's O.M. No. A-24011/22/2022-Estt.(Leave) dated 12.09.2022 on the subject mentioned above and to state that it has been decided by the competent authority to extend the package of concessions/incentives to Central Government employees working in Kashmir Valley for a further period of three years with effect from 01.08.2024. The package for the period of three years with effect from 01.08.2024 is as per Annexure.

2. The package of incentives is uniformly applicable to all Ministries/Departments and PSUs under the Government of India and they should ensure strict adherence to the rates prescribed in the package. The concerned Ministry/Department may ensure implementation and monitoring of the package in conformity with the approved package, and therefore, all court cases in which verdicts are given contrary to the package would have to be contested by the Ministries/Departments concerned.

DETAILS OF PACKAGE OF CONCESSIONS OR INCENTIVES TO THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES WORKING IN KASHMIR VALLEY IN ATTACHED/SUBORDINATE OFFICES OR PUBLIC SECTOR UNDERTAKINGS FALLING UNDER THE CONTROL OF CENTRAL GOVERNMENT.

[Kashmir Valley comprises of ten Districts namely, Anantnag, Baramulla, Budgam, Kupwara, Pulwama, Srinagar, Kulgam, Shopian, Ganderbal and Bandipora.]

Extension of Special concessions / incentives to Central Government employees working in the 10 districts of Kashmir Valley for a further period of three years with effect from 01.08.2024.

I. <u>ADDITIONAL HOUSE RENT ALLOWANCES AND OTHER</u> CONCESSIONS:

(A) EMPLOYEES POSTED IN KASHMIR VALLEY:

- (i) The employees have an option to move their families to a selected place of their choice in Country at Government expenses and travelling Allowance for the families allowed as admissible in permanent transfer inclusive of the Composite Transfer Grant at the rate of 80 per cent of the last month's basic pay.
- (ii) The employees who do not wish to move their families to a selected place of residence are paid per diem allowance of Rs. 141/- per day for each day of attendance to compensate for any additional expense in transportation from to and from office, which is at par with the reimbursement of travel charges for travel within the city in terms of the Department of Expenditure OM No. 19030/1/2017-E.IV, dated the 13th July, 2017 and Government instructions and decisions taken, thereafter *vide* O.M. No 1/5/2024-E.II(B) dated 21st October, 2024.



- (iii) The employees who opt to move their families to selected place of their choice in Country shall not be eligible for per diem allowance since they avail the benefits of Composite Transfer Grant at the rate of 80 per cent of the last month's basic pay.
- (iv) Departmental arrangements will be made for stay, security and transportation to the place of work for employees.
- (v) The employees shall be eligible for drawing House Rent Allowance provided departmental arrangement is not made for their stay. They shall also be eligible for drawing additional House Rent Allowance at the rate of Class 'Y' city (20 per cent of basic pay) admissible to the Central Government employees has been revised and being paid at the enhanced rates in accordance with the provision contained in the Government instructions, especially the Department of Expenditure O.M. No. 2/5/2017-E.II(B) dated 07th July, 2017 and O.M No. 1/5/2024-E.II(B) dated 21st October, 2024 except those employees who have retained Government Accommodation at their last place of posting.

(B) THE PERIOD OF TEMPORARY DUTY EXTENDED TO SIX MONTHS.

For the period of temporary duty, an incentive known as the Kashmir Valley Special Incentive shall be paid at the following rates along with food charges (as per 7th Pay Commission norms), apart from departmental arrangements for stay, security and transportation:

Pay Range	Rate Per month
	(on pro rata)
(i) Level 14 and above	Rs.9000
(ii) Level 12 and 13	Rs.8000
(iii) Level 9 to 11	Rs.7000
(iv) Level 6 to 8	Rs.6000
(v) Level 5 and below	Rs.4500



II. MESSING FACILITIES:

Messing allowance at par with rates of Ration Money Allowance given to the Central Armed Police Forces personnel, at present @ Rs.142.75/- per day will be provided.

III. PAYMENT OF MONTHLY PENSION:

The Pensioners of the Kashmir Valley who are unable to draw their monthly pensions through either Public Sector Banks or Pay and Accounts Office or treasuries, from which they were receiving their pensions, shall be given pensions outside the Valley, where they have settled, in relaxation of relevant provisions.

NOTE:-

- The package of concessions / incentives shall be admissible in Kashmir Valley comprising of ten districts namely, Anantnag, Baramulla, Budgam, Kupwara, Pulwama, Srinagar, Kulgam, Shopian, Ganderbal and Bandipora.
- The Package of concessions / incentives shall be admissible to Temporary Status Casual Laborers working in Kashmir Valley in terms of Para 5(i) of the Casual Laborers (Grant of Temporary Status and Regularization) Scheme of Government of India, 1993.
- 3. The benefit of additional house rent allowance admissible under the Kashmir Valley package shall be admissible to all Central Government employees posted in Kashmir Valley irrespective of whether they are natives of Kashmir Valley, if they choose to move their families anywhere in Country subject to the conditions governing the grant of these allowances.
- The facilities of Messing Allowance and Per Diem Allowances shall also be allowed to natives of Kashmir Valley in terms of the Kashmir Valley package.

Dear Secretary,

I would like to draw your attention to the D.O. letter of even number dated 27th February, 2024 of my predecessor (**copy enclosed**) regarding huge importance of creating Gender Friendly Spaces in public places. This is crucial for ensuring the well-being and meeting the needs of working women within and outside the office/work premises. During the hearing on 19.02.2025, the Hon'ble Supreme Court, in Writ Petition (C) No. 950/2022 (Maatr Sparsh, an initiative by the Avyaan Foundation vs. UoI), has noticed the efforts of the Union of India (UOI) and given specific directions to the Union Government to issue the earlier advisory as a reminder to all the States/ UTs and other stakeholders.

- 2. In compliance of the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court, I request you to kindly take necessary steps in right earnest and formulate a time-bound action plan to implement appropriate measures in your Ministry/ Department and other attached/ subordinate offices.
- 3. I shall be grateful if you could kindly inform about the action taken in the matter including some good practices, if they have already been implemented in your Ministry/Department or other offices under the jurisdiction of your Ministry/Department. It would also be appreciated that if some measures that are easily implementable are taken immediately.

Dear Secretary,

I am writing to underscore the need to create Gender Friendly Spaces in public places that is of paramount importance for ensuring the well-being and taking good care of the needs of working women within and outside the office premises. This becomes incumbent as the country aspires to become a developed nation by the year we celebrate 100 years of India's Independence in 2047, that is not possible unless increased and meaningful participation of women in the workforce is ensured.

- 2. I would like to highlight here that due to a slew of measures taken by the Government in the past 5 years, the Female Labour Force Participation Rate in India has increased from 23.3% to 37.0%. The World Bank estimates that even if half of the women in India can join the workforce, the country can potentially boost its economic growth by 1.5 percentage points, thus raising India's GDP to 9 percent per year. To achieve this, the barriers to women's workforce participation have to be addressed sooner than later.
- 3. To continue the existing efforts of the Government of India through adoption of a comprehensive whole-of government approach, such as the Palna scheme (Anganwadi-cum-Creches), providing free day-care and creche facilities for working women in urban areas, the recent joint advisory issued by Ministry of Women and Child Development with Ministry of Labour and Employment and also another advisory with Ministry of Road Transport and Highways to employers for promoting women's workforce participation as well as expansive legislative frameworks such as the POSH Act, 2013, the Ministry seeks your support in creating gender-friendly spaces in workplaces of Ministries/ Departments along with their affiliated institutions, PSUs and infrastructure to promote women's workforce participation. An indicative list of activities is outlined below:

 The installation of Sanitary Pad vending machines and incinerators in washrooms addresses the fundamental menstrual hygiene needs of female employees.

ii. Allocating space for feeding rooms, restrooms and yoga rooms. These facilities cater to the physical and mental health needs of female employees that will also ensure compliance of the provisions of the Maternity Benefit (Amendment) Act, 2017. This Act mandates support for women during their post-delivery period.

iii. Incorporating at least one creche facilities in every public building having 50 or more employees to support working mothers, promoting gender equality and facilitating the retention and advancement of talented female professionals.

- 4. This may entail expenditure and many people may not find it of that much importance, but investing in these essential facilities will certainly have a long-lasting impact on the well-being and productivity of female engaged in the workforce. By creating a supportive and inclusive workplace, we not only comply with legal standards but also encourage women's full and meaningful participation, contributing significantly to the growth and success of the country. For example, in case of Ministry of Railways and Ministry of Civil Aviation, provisions should be made for sanitary pad vending machines, feeding rooms at all conspicuous locations depending on the footfall of women and girls.
- 5. I shall be grateful if you could kindly take necessary steps in earnest and formulate a time-bound action plan to implement all these far reaching measures in your Ministry/Department and other offices in the run up to next International Women's Day on 8th March, 2024. It would be appreciable if some measures, e.g., installation of sanitary napkin vending machines are done immediately.
- 6. I would be happy to know the action taken by you in this regard and would be delighted if you could share some good practices if they have already been implemented in your Ministry/Department or other Offices.

Dear Secretary,

I am writing to underscore the need to create Gender Friendly Spaces in public places that is of paramount importance for ensuring the well-being and taking good care of the needs of working women within and outside the office premises. This becomes incumbent as the country aspires to become a developed nation by the year we celebrate 100 years of India's Independence in 2047, that is not possible unless increased and meaningful participation of women in the workforce is ensured.

- 2. I would like to highlight here that due to a slew of measures taken by the Government in the past 5 years, the Female Labour Force Participation Rate in India has increased from 23.3% to 37.0%. The World Bank estimates that even if half of the women in India can join the workforce, the country can potentially boost its economic growth by 1.5 percentage points, thus raising India's GDP to 9 percent per year. To achieve this, the barriers to women's workforce participation have to be addressed sooner than later.
- 3. To continue the existing efforts of the Government of India through adoption of a comprehensive whole-of government approach, such as the Palna scheme (Anganwadicum-Creches), providing free day-care and creche facilities for working women in urban areas, the recent joint advisory issued by Ministry of Women and Child Development with Ministry of Labour and Employment and also another advisory with Ministry of Road Transport and Highways to employers for promoting women's workforce participation as well as expansive legislative frameworks such as the POSH Act, 2013, the Ministry seeks your support in creating gender-friendly spaces in workplaces of Ministries/ Departments along with their affiliated institutions, PSUs and infrastructure to promote women's workforce participation. An indicative list of activities is outlined below:
 - The installation of Sanitary Pad vending machines and incinerators in washrooms addresses the fundamental menstrual hygiene needs of female employees.
- ii. Allocating space for feeding rooms, restrooms and yoga rooms. These facilities cater to the physical and mental health needs of female employees that will also ensure compliance of the provisions of the Maternity Benefit (Amendment) Act, 2017. This Act mandates support for women during their post-delivery period.
- iii. Incorporating at least one creche facilities in every public building having 50 or more employees to support working mothers, promoting gender equality and facilitating the retention and advancement of talented female professionals.

- 4. This may entail expenditure and many people may not find it of that much importance, but investing in these essential facilities will certainly have a long-lasting impact on the well-being and productivity of female engaged in the workforce. By creating a supportive and inclusive workplace, we not only comply with legal standards but also encourage women's full and meaningful participation, contributing significantly to the growth and success of the country. For example, in case of Ministry of Railways and Ministry of Civil Aviation, provisions should be made for sanitary pad vending machines, feeding rooms at all conspicuous locations depending on the footfall of women and girls.
- 5. I shall be grateful if you could kindly take necessary steps in earnest and formulate a time-bound action plan to implement all these far reaching measures in your Ministry/Department and other offices in the run up to next International Women's Day on 8th March, 2024. It would be appreciable if some measures, e.g., installation of sanitary napkin vending machines are done immediately.
- I would be happy to know the action taken by you in this regard and would be delighted if you could share some good practices if they have already been implemented in your Ministry/Department or other Offices.
